 - i. FY2024 RFP was distributed. No major changes from last year. Are there any comments/suggestions about the ranking process from prior years?

 - 1. Working on ranking 2023 projects. Number of projects have decreased as supply costs increase.
 - 2. ADFG is wrapping up the HBII hiring process. Position is involved with the Mat Su cost share program.
 - 3. Working with Ben on a spruce tree cabling project in Soldotna

- b. Non-Permanent Members:
 - i. KBNERR Coowe Walker
 - 1. Working with the KPB assembly to revise the ground water amendment, which currently doesn't have any provisions for fish.
 - 2. Working with the City of Homer to acquire peatlands.
 - 3. Looking at incorporating beavers into climate mitigation projects to increase carbon sequestration.
 - 4. New Davidson fellow from UAF is studying the effects of aquaculture on benthic communities.
 - ii. KPB River Center Samantha Lopez
 - iii. USFS Adam Cross
 - 1. Prepping for phase 2 of a bank restoration project on the Resurrection River.
 - 2. Is aware of two open positions with partner organizations. (Contact Adam for more details. Positions available with Trout Unlimited and National Forest Foundation)
 - iv. DEC Sarah Apsens
 - 1. Has been working the past month on data review and analysis in water quality.
 - 2. Wrapping up the second year of a two year water quality monitoring project on the Kenai.
 - v. ADFG Tony Munter
 - 1. Recently finished the permitting for DOT's Baycrest to Anchor Point project, which will reconstruct the Sterling Hwy from milepost 157 to 169. It will take 3-4 years, and include 6 fish passage culverts. Many aspects are comparable to the 45 to 60 project near Cooper Landing.
 - 2. Working on many fish passage projects peninsula wide.
 - 3. Working on streambank projects as well.
 - 4. Kathrine asked if there were any opportunities for outreach to private land owners in regards to invasive species presence on their properties.
 - vi. KWF Benjamin Meyer
 - 1. Wrapping up a project identifying land parcels with cold water refugia. Contacted land owners about conservation practices.
 - 2. Wrapping up quality assurance project plan for agency baseline project.
 - Mentioned the National Coastal Resilience Fund NFWF funding opportunity. The entire Kenai Peninsula is considered coastal and would qualify for project submissions. John Morton has more details.
 - 4. Gave a presentation to the KRSMA board on baseline monitoring project.
 - 5. Steering Committee members may get a change in calendar invites for future meetings as responsibilities transfer to Melissa.

vii. KP-CISMA – Katherine Schake

- 1. Has a biennial public outreach workshop planned for this spring, in addition to annual spring training.
- 2. Gave an update on invasive species legislation. There is interest in forming an invasive species council in response to European Green Crab.
- 3. Matt Bowser has identified a new reed canary grass area and determined it was not worth treating. Now shifting efforts to monitoring for other invasives.
- 4. Entering agreement with Chugach National Forest to monitor high traffic areas.
- 5. Excited about Anchorage Soil and Water is getting up and running.
- 6. Planning outreach and education efforts to local plant retailers about selling invasive plants.
