Addendum A: Fiscal Year 2024 Resquest for Proposals A.1. Proposed Timeline

- Sept 29, 2022 NFHP board approves FY 2024 National Conservation Priorities (link)
- Mid-November 2022 Pre-notify organizations that regularly apply of FY24 RFP
- December 5, 2022 KPFHP announces FY24 RFP to wide audience

- Mid-February, 2023 Closing date to receive proposals from applicants
- Late-February 2023 Steering committee members receive proposals to score
- One week later steering committee meets to discuss proposals
- March 6th, 2023 Coordinator receives all proposal scores from steering committee members
- March 31, 2023 Due date for the Coordinator to submit projects to the NFHP board

A.2 General Notes on FY24 RFP

- The RFP is an opportunity for particularly creative, innovative, local projects
 - E.g. inventory; planning; analysis
 - Different ways of knowing; co-production of data
 - Supporting larger infrastructure projects w/ monitoring, pre and post construction
 - Outreach and education
