5 Proposals came in right at 5pm yesterday – Robert forward to Steering Committee Mike will need to turn in selected proposals by December 1st Think we will have \$90,000 – unknown when solid amount determined Received requests totaling \$110,000 All appear to meet format/criteria requirements – eligible for review

Preliminary discussion regarding each proposal:

*ADNR/KRSMA - \$25,000 - Watershed planning primer

Needs a final product

3 outcomes listed at end of proposal

Understanding – course offered

Prioritized list

Organizational structure

Symposium reaches beyond peninsula – people around state expressed interest Budget is strange – inkind/real costs need clarified

*USFWS - \$28,000 – Anchor River assessment/response to climate change

How review proposal to make sure it's good science? No partnerships are included in proposal – this will come out in the scoring Can this be used as a baseline study? Don't think so – unsure Is this already an on-going project? Yes – in year 2 or 3 Holistic effort at looking at fish habitat – referred to as "Ripple Model" Good concept – needs more detail on parameters Is this funding request for a new component? Is this project currently funded?

*HSWCD - \$5,000 – Stariski Creek education BMPs

Had a tangible end product Who will they get materials from? Match dollars are off What is the focus? Culverts as the only issue? Methods section details plan/presentation focus Smallest request by far Education is always a good bet

*ADFG - \$38,000 – Soldotna Creek pike eradication prep

KWF is involved in proposal for specialized equipment that ADFG doesn't have No comprehensive plan? There are state and peninsula wide plans Does ADFG normally work on this?

The project proposed last year – did not get funded – USFWS funded separately 2 parts to this proposal

Eradicate with learning about the hydrology

Procure facilitator to do P.R. program

Scientists are not trained to facilitate public meetings

Graduated approach to pike eradication so far

Got beat up pretty bad at Soldotna Creek presenation

Facilitator concept in response to public input

This project gets done something the KPFHP wants done The baseline research has other useful applications Not enough detail provided to determine success

Could provide list of criteria with funding

*ADFG - \$13,400 - Slikok Creek Chinook evaluation

Establishes a weir and evaluates habitat up/down creek Has declining population of Chinook – discovered during culvert replacement No habitat evaluation method articulated

How is this applicable to area beyond Slikok Creek Focus appears to be on fisheries – not habitat Fund only the habitat part – not the weir? Counting fish is part of the habitat assessment Use as an example of declining fish population in small tributaries Focus on juveniles Needs a more formalized habitat assessment Are there livestock in the creek? Do we want to fund the wier?

General discussion regarding proposals

New or unexpected proposals okay – but what about low priority projects? If it's a priority for KPFHP – then it's okay if it's low priority in agency Completed projects/results may increase priority awareness KPFHP will need to re-prioritize list periodically Eventually will have to consider how to handle mulit-year projects If we offer decreased funding – does it kill the project? Does KPFHP have a logo to put on projects? Can the funds be used to create a design logo? Don't think so

Or should USFWS logo be used?

Would be nice to have KPFHP logo on products we're involved in

How much work to we want to create for ourselves?

Interviews = a lot of work Use this proposal process as a learning experience for next year Most of the proposals submitted were put together in a week – and it shows In future issue a "pre-call"? Some agencies put out a notice of call coming out How can we cut down to \$90,000? KPFHP needs to get better organized for proposal calls What standards are we accepting for habitat assessment?

Different proposals may receive different levels of scrutinty Will the project change or die if funding is decreased? Could do across the board recession – fund all at 83% of request Could eliminate a portion of proposal or 1 proposal in entirety Not enough review of proposals yet to make decisions regarding funding yet Need to have decision made before Thanksgiving
