Minutes from KPFHP Steering Committee meeting on 6/6/210 approved with minor grammatical edits

New KPFHP Steering Committee members were introduced:

- Christy Cincotta, Tyonek Tribal Conservation District Executive Director, excited to participate, also a member of the Mat-Su FHP

- Marcus Mueller, background in wildlife management/biology; works at KPB in Public Lands and has the opportunity to be around planning discussions

- Tracy Smith, Habitat Biologist, took over Roger Harding's old position, NFHP coordinator for ADFG

Deadline for KPFHP CFP Friday, Oct. 7

- Oct. 13th works for most KPFHP Steering Committee members for proposal Q&A; send specific questions to Jack if you are not able to attend

- Nov. 7th KPFHP Steering Committee meets to rank/selects projects

- Nov. 14th deadline to submit selected projects to USFWS

KPFHP Ranking Criteria statement "Administrative costs do not exceed 18% of total project cost" discussed; no changes

Sue updated the group on <u>CIK KPFHP Outreach</u> funding:

- Artist Kaitlin Vadla produced three original paintings for CIK to use to create "Home is Where the Habitat Is" posters which have been distributed widely; Marcus suggested contacting Ted Stevens International Airport; Sue stated that she is hoping to see them at the River Center as well; posters provide a nice, succinct message that helps establish a connection to place

- Also produced 2016 tide books which have been distributed all across Cook Inlet; they include 33 pages of educational material and have been well received

- Another aspect of grant has been to keep active conversations about habitat, the AWC and the importance of riparian areas

Jack updated the group on <u>KWF Stream Watch KPFHP</u> funding:

- Lowest volunteer hours ever, but highest trash collection (likely due to efforts on Kasilof); new coordinator was hired at KWF: Melissa Steritz; Forest Service also transitioned Stream Watch staff this year; State of AK supporting efforts on Kasilof (about 8k/year)

Jack updated the group on <u>KWF Elodea KPFHP</u> funding:

- Program at KWF stalled out with Edgar's departure; KWF hired new program coordinator from Kenai NW Refuge: Jennifer Peura; KWF asked for and received extension on current invasive funding

Branden updated the group on <u>KWF NHD KPFHP</u> funding:

- Lower and Upper KP watersheds completed (can be downloaded here: http://nhd.usgs.gov/data.html); St. Mary's crew spent a week in June 2016 validating modeled hydrology and then conflated new hydrology to NHD early Sept. 2016

- Kenai Fjords area (USGS HUC8 19020202) is proposed to be completed next

- DEC/Horizon Systems starting NHD+ modeling on KP, first iteration will include revision of catchments to match new surface hydrology

- USGS discussing the potential of funding N HD update for completion of KPB/KPFHP boundary, which would include the watersheds on the west side of Cook Inlet

Brief discussion on the KPFHP 2017 Science Symposium – April 5&6, 2017

- Venue is Sterling Community Center with breakout sessions to be planned around town

- Potential for AK Salmon and People workshop component (Jack is partner on submitted grant)

- Marcus suggested a "Science to Management intake" or Q&A session or discussion

Jamie Trammell (EPSCoR) joined meeting at 15:00

Jaimie introduced a new survey from the Salmon 2050 efforts the past 4-5 years

- Sue suggested identifying a link between Salmon 2050 efforts and KPFHP index watersheds and to provide tracking metrics for watersheds and complimentary assessments

- Jaimie pointed out that EPSCoR as a whole is transitioning to education and outreach and any thoughts from KPFHP on how to best accomplish these components are welcomed

- Ginny suggested a tie-in to the scientific data that exists in the community

- Marcus suggested KPFHP consider stewardship of EPSCoR data moving forward

- Jamie encouraged attendees to review the proposed survey and seconds Marcus' statement about KPFHP consideration of stewardship of data

- Sue suggested that EPSCoR – Salmon 2050 think about how the KPFHP symposium can best benefit them

KPFHP bound by USFWS to produce a **newsletter** to all members, Jack currently working on and looking for content

<u>NFHP Conference</u> Oct. 24-27, 2016 – Jack and Cindy going (Tracy waiting on State approval)

<u>KPFHP site visit discussed</u> – tentative to Russian River to help Sue set up temp. monitoring site; Sue will send out dates when she decides, tentatively sometime between Oct 14 and October 21.

Member's comments:

- Marcus – KPB updating comprehensive plan, funding will be before assembly soon; suggested that KPFHP Steering Committee meetings give permanent agenda spot to EPSCoR

- Branden – welcomed Christy, Marcus and Tracy as new members

- Ginny – Kachemak Bay critical area management plan is undergoing update

- Kyle – Suggested in-person KPFHP meeting and looking through CAP again

- Adam – Forest Service changing staff member soon and may affect Steering Committee member

- Christy – Lots of work happening across the inlet in developing a Water Action Plan from Nikolai to Beluga; lots of monitoring of temp/pike and culvert designs.

- Sue – Started on KPFHP project, a camera-based stream stage monitoring system on Anchor River

- Erika – Director of NOAA fisheries in Anchorage and Homer today/tomorrow, will stress the need to improve marine side of FHP

- Marie – Enjoyed EPSCoR presentation, also suggested in-person meeting; KHLT recently launched King Maker and Baby Salmon Live Here campaigns- send suggestions for placement of signs to Marie

- Tracy – Excited to work with KP, SW and Mat-Su Partnerships
